Football, 1914

This year's athletic teams have been the best in Garfield's history. She enjoyed a remarkably successful football season. The most prominent obstacle overcome by the purple and white warriors was their lack of weight. In practically all of her games she was out-weighted

on an average of 10 pounds to the man, but what the team lacked in weight it made up for in speed, and as a result she was not fairly beaten by any team in Indiana. It is true she lost to Linton, but as that team was later declared ineligible, it has no bearing on her record. Oakland, an Illinois team, was the only team which did defeat Garfield fairly, and they out-weighted the men from Terre Haute by a large margin. The best home game of the season was probably the one in which Robinson was defeated 18-12. The next

two games with Jasonville and Bloomfield, respectively, Garfield also put on the right side of the ledger. She ended up the season in a blaze of glory by defeating Brazil 40-0 before 3 car loads of rooters who accompanied the team.
