Apr. 14. Juniors beat Seniors 6-3.

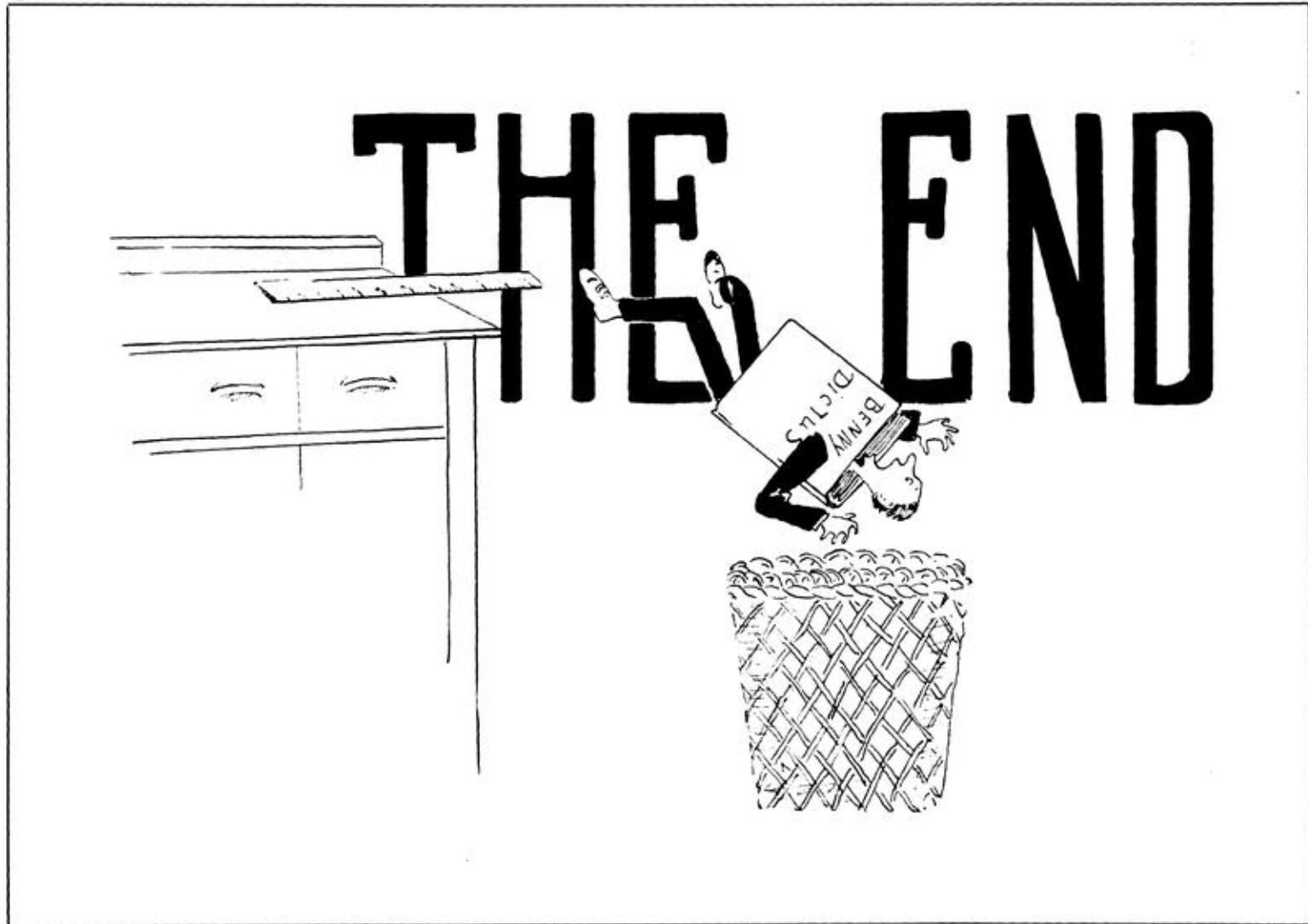
Apr. 15. Editor of Benedictus has nervous prostration.
