



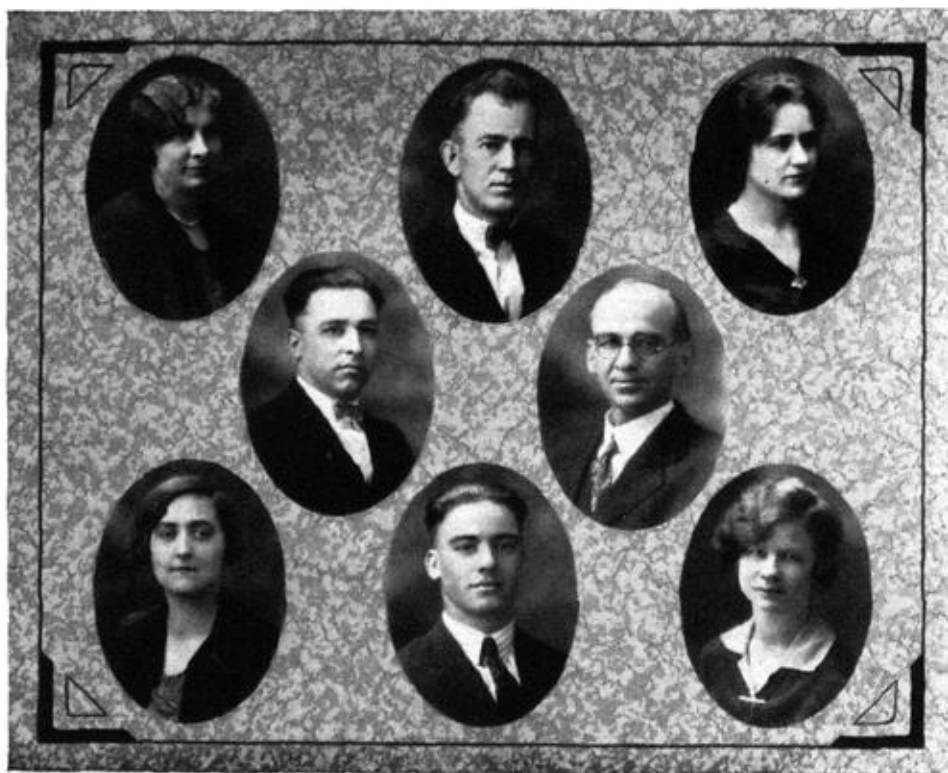
Maryland School

THE Maryland School building was finished in 1923. That year there were students of ten grades in this building. Mr. McWilliams was principal, and he and Miss Furry were the only high school teachers employed at the beginning of the school year; however, Miss Barbee was changed from the fifth grade room to the high school during the first semester. The next year the seventh and eighth grades were taken to Youngstown, leaving the first six grades, and the three high school grades at Maryland.

In 1925 the high school students moved to the new building. The removal of these students has relieved the overcrowded condition, and the Maryland children now have plenty of building and play ground room.

The present juniors and seniors will not forget those old school yells into which the name "Maryland" fit so nicely, and the time when the band under the leadership of Mr. Leslie, played "Maryland My Maryland" so enthusiastically, while our Maryland baseball team exemplified the Maryland school spirit in a fine ball game.
