Wiley placed consistently high in the 25 speech competitions. Wiley sent legislators to the student congress in Peru and Elkhart. Large delegations attended meets at Howe, Peru, Kokomo, Garfield, Evansville, I. S. T. C., Ball State, Purdue, Butler, Indiana University, Eminence, Fort Wayne, South Bend, Crawfordsville and Indianapolis.

Wiley maintained its title as top Indiana debate school by defeating opposition at South Bend, Reitz of Evansville, and winning for the second straight year the N. F. L. state championship.

Favorable attention throughout the city was devoted to

the weekly Wiley Debate Club civic affairs program, "News, views and Interviews," heard Sunday at 5:15 over WBOW—AM and FM.

Wiley students participated in two football "Radio Days" over WTHI. On September 25th, Wiley and Garfield students ran WTHI from 5:56 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. to boost the Turkey Day game. Again in November, some 35 Wileyites were heard before the Armistice Day game. Several broadcasts of city council meetings were scheduled by Wiley debaters, as controversial issues arose throughout the school year.
